AHPs provide treatment that helps transform people's lives.





AHPs carry their own caseloads and work as autonomous professionals.

Health and social care today is about teamwork so AHPs will also be part of a team (and may even lead one).

This can mean working with other AHPs or other professionals such GPs, hospital doctors, teachers, or social workers for example.




## What is Chiropractic?

Chiropractic is a regulated, primary healthcare profession, best known for:

- Diagnosis
- Treatment
- Management

of patients with primarily musculoskeletal conditions (muscles and joints).



## AECC What do Chiropractors treat?

Patients are often in pain caused by problems with or injury to:

- joints, ligaments
- tendons, muscles and nerves
- often related to the neck and lower back
- also to the extremities

## AECC Where do Chiropractors work?

- Within a Clinic setting independently or with other chiropractors / professionals
- They may have a designated room at a GP practice working inside or outside of the NHS
- Within a Sports Club, having a designated treatment room



Much of a day in the life of a chiropractor is spent seeing patients, checking the analysing the spine - there is also the need to complete accompanying paperwork, (medical notes).

#### Chiropractors will then treat their patients with:

- massage
- adjustment
- heat therapy
- and possibly ultrasound to restore balance to the system.

They may prescribe changes in diet, exercises, or supports to aid the process.

Working hours vary, giving you great quality of life.

## Did you know?

## Did you know?

A study in 2006, found that chiropractic treatments increased muscle strength in athletes' leg muscles:

The results of the study showed a significant (10%) increase in quadriceps (leg muscle) strength in the treatment group after the chiropractic treatment.



### **MChiro Programme**

- The Chiropractic programme is an integrated Master's programme, commonly known as a Master of Chiropractic degree (MChiro)
- Integrated Masters can be funded through a student loan in the same way as undergraduate degrees, so they are a great way to fund a Masters qualification.





#### **MChiro**

- Five year programme with two entry points.
- Students will either start in year 0 or year 1 dependent on their background qualifications, with year 4 being the final year.
- Strongly vocational: hands on from day one

A route to study the chiropractic degree without having sufficient science qualifications


Year 1

Graduates may be required to complete a further minimum of one year's supervised clinical practice under the auspices of the relevant National Association






